On October 21st, 2021, I was walking out of bldg. 100 with my wife Rachelle Clark and Christie Slape at approximately 8:30. I know it was approximately 8:30 because that is when President Weir moved the meeting into the second closed session. As we we exited building 100, we got to the top of the stairs outside that led to the parking lot, and a man turned around and the below conversation between him and I ensued as we walked to our vehicles. The man's conversation, attitude and body language were very intense and harassing in nature. During the conversation, I believed things were about to escalate into a physical confrontation. My wife felt the same and was concerned for our safety.

Man: "Hey Dustin."

Me: "yes? "

Man: "This thing you're doing, it's not going to work."

Me: "What thing are you talking about?"

Man: "This whole thing you're organizing."

Me: "What thing am I organizing?"

Man: "You know what I'm talking about....and using a quote by John Lewis, it's not the same thing. That man bled for those rights."

Me: "You don't even know me. You don't know what I've bled for."

Man: "I don't give a fuck about you. You can just fuck off!"

Then the man got into a black Lexus and drove off. We immediately got into our vehicle and left Round Rock High School and went home.

On October 21st, I was standing in the hallway of bldg. 100, outside of the Old Lecture Hall school board meeting room during the first closed session of the meeting. President Amy Weir moved the meeting into closed session immediately after the public comments. This occurred at about the 1:08:00 mark of the meeting, and since the meeting started at 5:30, this would have been approximately 6:38pm.

All community members were asked to wait outside of the room during closed session, so almost everyone went and stood in the hall until we were to be allowed back in. During most of the break, I was standing in front of a folding table that had been placed near the entrance doors to allow community members to sign up to speak.

Across from me was a group of 5-8 people standing and talking. I recall seeing Christie Slape and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was just a few feet from me. About 10-15 mins into the closed session break, a man wearing a glasses, a white shirt, and grey shorts came down through the hallway walking vigorously, and as he approached [REDACTED] he paused and it sounded like he said something, but I could not make it out because he was wearing a mask. He then grabbed her by her shoulders and moved her aside and continued walking down the hall. He stopped to talk with Jenn Brown who was leaning against some lockers. He stayed there talking to her for quite some time.
