For many years, the Round Rock Independent School District (RRISD) has partnered with the Round Rock Police Department and Williamson County Sheriff's Office to provide School Resource Officers to protect students and staff. As the Mayor of the City of Round Rock and the County Judge of Williamson County, we are interested in keeping our campuses safe and are united in our opinion the RRISD has grown large enough that its needs will be better served through the creation of its own police department.


We recognize this is a large undertaking and feel the City of Round Rock and Williamson County have both shown willingness to participate in the process, but the time has come for a decision.
